Project Priorities

13,900 sq. ft. of existing space will be reconfigured, repurposed, remodeled, furnished and equipped allowing more efficient and compliant/accessible visitor spaces including replacing wet suppression fire systems and outdated HVAC/climate controls in the MDC archival and records repository.

24,000 sq. ft. of new space will create more inclusive and accessible public spaces for archival research and educational programming as well as increase archival capacities allowing for archive and record repository growth in terms of collections.

New Energy Efficient Construction

This project aligns well with the Governor's strategic priorities in that it preserves and upgrades 13,900 sq. ft. of existing state-owned infrastructure, increasing efficiencies and lowering operating costs. This project makes public resources more accessible to those with disabilities and allows MDC to archive more MN history. This project protects existing repository records and historical artifacts in addition to growing programming opportunities and creating new revenue that can be reinvested into future facility needs.

Historical & Systemic Disparities & Inequities

This project significantly address disparities in that our campus <u>is not</u> 100% ADA compliant, and this project will help reach our compliance goals much quicker.
