

1.1 Senator moves to amend S.F. No. 3900 as follows:

1.2 Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

1.3 "Section 1. **DIGITAL GEOGRAPHIC INFORMATION SYSTEM MAPPING FOR**
1.4 **SCHOOL FACILITIES; APPROPRIATION.**

1.5 (a) \$7,000,000 in fiscal year 2024 is appropriated from the state government special
1.6 revenue fund for 911 emergency telecommunications services to the commissioner of public
1.7 safety to issue grants to the regional emergency communications boards as defined by
1.8 Minnesota Statutes, section 403.392. This is a onetime appropriation and is available until
1.9 June 30, 2026.

1.10 (b) If awarded a grant, a regional communications board must use the grant funds
1.11 exclusively to create digital geographic information system mapping data of facilities
1.12 managed by a school district; charter school; intermediate school district or cooperative
1.13 unit under Minnesota Statutes, section 123A.24, subdivision 2; the Perpich Center for Arts
1.14 Education; the Minnesota State Academies; private schools; or a Tribal contract school that
1.15 serves children in early childhood or prekindergarten programs or students enrolled in
1.16 kindergarten through grade 12 within the regional emergency communications board's
1.17 jurisdiction.

1.18 (c) The data created pursuant to paragraph (b) must be:

1.19 (1) compatible with software platforms used by local, state, and federal public safety
1.20 agencies that provide emergency services to the specific school for which the data is provided
1.21 without requiring such agencies to purchase additional software or requiring a fee to view
1.22 or access the data;

1.23 (2) compatible with security software platforms in use by the specific school for which
1.24 the data is provided without requiring the local law enforcement agencies or school districts
1.25 to purchase additional software or requiring a fee to view or access the data;

1.26 (3) verified for accuracy, and a walkthrough must occur unless no physical modifications
1.27 to the school have occurred; and

1.28 (4) perpetually available to schools mapped pursuant to a grant and the Department of
1.29 Public Safety.

1.30 (d) The statewide emergency communications board may implement further requirements
1.31 at their discretion.

- 2.1 (e) Each regional emergency communication board that receives a grant must complete
2.2 the mapping project and report completion to the commissioner on or before July 1, 2026.
2.3 Upon request, the commissioner may grant a reasonable extension of time to the requesting
2.4 regional emergency communication board to complete the project.
- 2.5 (f) Regional emergency communications boards shall work collaboratively with schools
2.6 and public safety agencies to include local law enforcement, fire agencies, EMS, and 911
2.7 during the procurement process.
- 2.8 (g) Any data created under this section is classified as nonpublic data as defined in
2.9 Minnesota Statutes, section 13.02, subdivision 9."
