#### **Bill Description**

This bill relates to cybersecurity and requires reporting of cybersecurity incidents impacting public-sector organizations in Minnesota.

The bill defines a cybersecurity incident as "actions taken through the use of an information system or network that result in an actual or potentially adverse effect on an information system, network, and the information residing therein.

Public-sector organizations in Minnesota refers to state agencies, political subdivisions, school districts, charter schools, intermediate districts, cooperative units and public postsecondary education institutions including third-party vendors and contractors utlized by these entities.

Cybersecurity incidents must be reported within 72 hours of when the public agency or government contractor reasonably identifies or believes that a cybersecurity incident has occurred.

Additionally the bill requires an annual report on cybersecurity incidents to the governor and legislative commission on cybersecurity.

#### **Assumptions**

The fiscal note outlines the cost of implementing the bill. The implementation will be funded by appropriations received by MNIT in the 2023 legislative session.

#### **Expenditure and/or Revenue Formula**

This bill introduces a mandate for reporting to the State cybersecurity incidents that impact public entities. Over recent years, MNIT has enhanced its collaboration with local governments and schools. Although this new legislation is not a prerequisite for ongoing cooperation, it enhances the effectiveness of these collaborative efforts. To support this initiative, additional Full-Time Equivalent (FTE) staff will be necessary. The 2023 legislative session provided additional funding to MNIT for increased collaboration efforts and enhanced vendor risk management efforts. This prior funding, while not explicitly planned for implementation of this law, will be able to meet provide resources needed for implementation.

The enhanced vendor risk management proposal from last session requires modifications to an existing tool that can also

accommodate accepting reports from public entities. The system cost to buy, build and implement this sytem modification is \$100,000. MNIT will also need the time of half an FTE to manage and coordinate the reporting process. MNIT can absorb these costs with existing funding.

There will be a cost to local entities to provide timely reporting of cybersecurity incidents to MNIT. The exact cost for each local entity will depend on the size of the entity, the frequency of incidents, and their cybersecurity capabilities. As a result, MNIT is unable to determine the precise fiscal impact to local entities.

SF4874-1A is a bill for an act relating to cybersecurity that requires reporting of cybersecurity incidents impacting public-sector organizations in Minnesota. Bill proposes coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 16E.

### **Assumptions**

Minnesota Management and Budget (MMB) does not expect direct financial impact related to this bill.

MMB does host sensitive data in IT systems and, due to MMB's responsibilities and oversight role, there is an expectation that MMB may become involved in some situations that arise.
