1.4	12.3 To the extent practical, A committee or subcommittee shall announce each meeting to
1.5	the public at least three calendar days 72 hours before convening. The notice must state the name
1.6	of the committee or subcommittee, the bill or bills to be considered, and the place and time of
1.7	meeting. The notice must be posted on the Senate's Web site and on all Senate bulletin boards in
1.8	the Capitol and the State Office Building. A notice must be sent to the House of Representatives
1.9	for posting as it deems necessary. If the three-day notice requirement cannot be met, the committee
1.10	or subcommittee shall give simultaneous notice to all of the known proponents and opponents of
1.11	the bill as soon as practicable Bills may be removed from a schedule with less than 72 hours notice.
1.12	Upon agreement between the chair of the committee and the ranking minority member of the
1.13	committee, items may be added to the agenda with less than 72 hours notice.
