## 56. STANDARDS OF ETHICAL CONDUCT

- 56.1 Members shall adhere to the highest standard of ethical conduct as embodied in the Minnesota Constitution, state law, and these rules.
- 56.2 A member shall not publish or distribute written material if the member knows or has reason to know that the material includes any statement that is false or clearly misleading, concerning a public policy issue or concerning the member's or another member's voting record or position on a public policy issue.
- 56.3 Improper conduct includes conduct that violates a rule or administrative policy of the Senate, that violates accepted norms of Senate behavior, that betrays the public trust, or that tends to bring the Senate into dishonor or disrepute.
- 56.4 Members of the Senate shall disclose potential conflicts of interest in the discharge of senatorial duties as provided in Minnesota Statutes, section 10A.07.
- 56.5 It is a conflict of interest for a member to participate in any proceedings on a bill that appropriates money or makes a grant to a for-profit or not-for-profit organization if that member or that member's spouse is an employee of that organization. It is a conflict of interest for a member to participate in any proceedings on a bill that appropriates money or makes a grant to a for-profit or not-for-profit organization if that organization's board of directors includes either: (1) that member; (2) that member's spouse; or (3) an individual who serves on another board of directors with that member or that member's spouse. A conflict of interest as described under this rule exists whether a bill names an organization as the recipient of an appropriation or grant or limits an appropriation or grant in such a manner that the appropriation or grant could only be made to one organization.
