1.4	12.3 To the extent practical, a committee or subcommittee shall announce each meeting to
1.5	the public at least three calendar days before convening. The notice must state the name of the
1.6	committee or subcommittee, the bill or bills to be considered, and the place and time of meeting.
1.7	The notice must be posted on the Senate's Web site and on all Senate bulletin boards in the Capitol
1.8	and the State Office Building. A notice must be sent to the House of Representatives for posting
1.9	as it deems necessary. If the three-day notice requirement cannot be met, the committee or
1.10	subcommittee shall give simultaneous notice to all of the known proponents and opponents of the
1.11	bill as soon as practicable (a) A committee or subcommittee must announce each meeting to the
1.12	public at least three calendar days before the day of the committee meeting. The notice must include
1.13	the following: the name of the committee or subcommittee; the specific bill or bills to be considered
1.14	identified by bill number; and the place and time of meeting. An agenda that does not include the
1.15	specific items listed in this paragraph is not sufficient notice as required by this Rule. The notice
1.16	must be posted on the Senate's website and distributed by the committee listserv.
1.17	(b) A bill or resolution must not be added to an agenda after the third calendar day before
1.18	the committee meeting, except by agreement between the chair of the committee and the ranking
1.19	minority member of the committee. Items may be removed from the agenda with less than three
1.20	days notice.
