

Request for Construction Sales Tax Exemption for Burnsville City Hall

THE REQUEST

The City of Burnsville is seeking special legislation for sales tax exemption on construction materials to REIMAGINE, RENOVATE and REUSE Burnsville City Hall.



This project is part of a larger civic campus construction project that also includes Burnsville Police. While construction materials for public safety facilities became tax exempt in 2021 (and are not part of this request), other city facility construction remains subject to state tax.


THE PROJECT
