Dear Chair Rest and Members of the Committee,

April 4, 2024

The Metropolitan Consortium of Community Developers (MCCD) is an association of nonprofit community development organizations and Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFIs) committed to expanding the wealth and resources of communities through housing opportunities and economic development initiatives. MCCD's mission to build strong and stable communities can only be achieved by addressing the harms and inequities that have shaped housing and economic development policies at every level of government. These policies have prevented Black, Indigenous and People of Color (BIPOC) and other communities from achieving housing stability, accessing capital, and building generational wealth.

We ask that you support SF 4875 to ensure that the Metro Sales and Use Tax for Housing is used effectively to address the metro's housing needs. This bill makes the following clarifications that are critically needed:

- Cities and counties receiving funds should maintain their locally funded housing expenditures at a level that is consistent with previous commitments. MCCD believes it is crucial that local governments continue to invest in housing, in addition to the new funds from the tax.
- Funds from the tax can be used to finance property operations, security services, and management of financially distressed residential properties. The purpose of the tax is to address the full continuum of housing needs, including preserving existing affordable housing units. Without financing the operations of affordable housing properties, we risk losing thousands of affordable units over the next year and a half.
- Proceeds from the tax can be used to fund supportive services or staff for supportive services providers for supportive housing.

These clarifications are critical to ensuring that the proceeds from the tax can be used flexibly to address each counties' unique housing needs, and we would appreciate the committee's support of SF 4875.
