
PROVIDERS' MOST POPULAR SPEED TIER

Opportunities Ahead

Opportunities:

- MN Cable Providers continue significant invest in expansion and system upgrades across the state.
- Minnesota's Border-to-Border, Low Density and Line Extension programs have traditionally been the gold standards for broadband deployment.
- BEAD Broadband, Equity, Access and Deployment. \$652 Million in BEAD funding coming to Minnesota.

Challenges Ahead

Challenges:

- **New MN Labor Program** With the nation's first, mandatory training program, the State has created an additional hurdles to broadband deployment.
- Attempts to Franchise Broadband A new internet tax introduced last session will harm all consumers and slow progression of deployment.
- **Permitting Challenges** Slow state and county approval processes for highway ROW, DNR, SHPO and tribal continue to provide barriers to deployment
- BEAD Broadband, Equity, Access and Deployment. \$652 Million in BEAD funding coming to Minnesota provides a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity, but a slow roll out and less flexibility had caused uncertainty for program participation.
