A model that works for all MN FBM

- Instructors work with on average 35-45 farms each
- Built on relationship with unbiased education at the core
- Serve students first, backed with college support

 Data driven decision making is core education=profitability driven for not just farm, but rural communities

FBM Instructor Point of View

- Family farms have many dynamics that impact student needs
 - Transitioning generations
 - Off farm obligations and support
- Finding experts to support farms day-to-day is getting more challenging- lenders, accountants, etc.
 - Often the FBM Instructor is the one mainstay

FBM Challenge Grant-Key to success

 - Stakeholder meetings with new audience
