- . \$8.95 million: Estimated Total Need





Gaia Roof and HVAC Replacement	Address increased cost estimates to replace the roof, repair exterior panels, and replace HVAC	\$826K
Loading Dock Drainage and Pavement Resurfacing	Address drainage issue and resurface loading dock area	\$250K
Energy Management System	Update Energy Management System software for all buildings on campus	\$454K
Total Amount		\$1.53 million

Top Priority: Gaia Roof and HVAC

Initial Estimate: \$600K Adjusted Estimate: \$826K

The Gaia building requires urgent roof replacement and repairs to its exterior precast concrete panels. Original cost estimates of \$900,000 in Asset Preservation funds are no longer sufficient due to rising costs. Additionally, replacing the HVAC system in conjunction with the roof replacement is the most cost-effective, long-term option.







Loading Dock Repairs

Cost Estimate: \$250k

Our loading dock area has a drainage issue that must be addressed before resurfacing. Once mitigation measures are in place, we can resurface the area to prevent premature deterioration.

Energy Management System

Cost Estimate: \$454K

Our main building was built in the early 1960s and our current building automation system is outdated. We plan to install new IP-based controllers for our air handling units, central heating loop, and unit heaters. These upgrades will modernize our infrastructure and improve energy efficiency.

ARTS & CULTURE SECTOR REPRESENTS 4.3% OF NATION'S GDP & 5 MILLION JOBS

The U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis reports that nationally the arts and culture sector is a **\$804 billion industry**, representing 4.3% of the nation's GDP—a larger share of the economy than construction (4%) or education services (1.1%).
