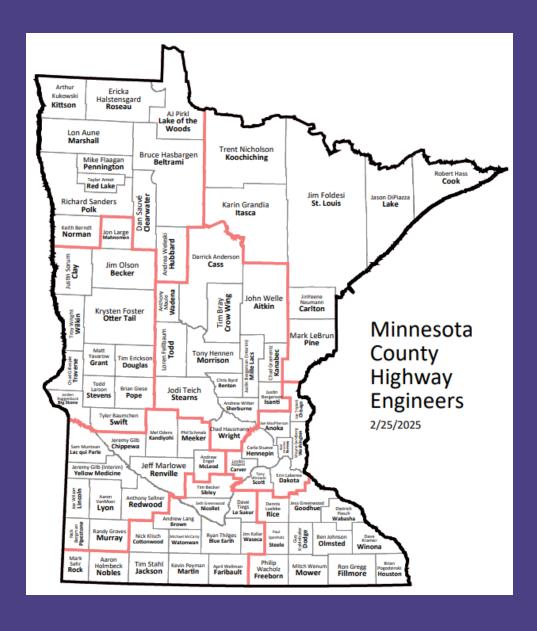

#### What is MCEA?



- The Minnesota County Engineers
   Association (MCEA) membership includes County Engineers from each of Minnesota's 87 counties
- County Engineers are appointed by each local County Board according to MN Statute 163.07, and must be registered Professional Engineers in the State of Minnesota.
- MCEA also includes associate members who are registered Professional Engineers working for a Minnesota county.
- MCEA is an affiliate of AMC

# AMC Bonding Priority



AMC supports a bonding bill that includes funding for transportation-related programs, including the Local Road Improvement Program, the Local Bridge Replacement Program, the Local Government Road Wetland Replacement Program, and the Busway Capital Improvement Program.

### Local Government Road Wetland Replacement Program





- Program (LGRWRP) is a wetland and upland habitat restoration program that generates mitigation credits for local road authorities to satisfy their federal and state wetland regulatory requirements
- MN law requires BWSR to replace wetlands that are drained or filled by public transportation projects on existing roads.
- The program is utilized for qualifying road reconstruction, repair, and rehabilitation projects conducted by local road authorities.

#### Local Government Road Wetland Replacement Program



- The table to the right shows the wetland credit balances in each BSA as of Sept. 6, 2024.
- Two of the ten BSAs have a credit balance of just over one year of demand, and five have a balance of less than one year.
- To overcome the credit deficit requires an appropriation of **\$26 million**. Once whole, annual funding necessary to maintain and support the program is estimated at **\$9.5 million**.

## Local Road Improvement Program



- Grant program administered by State Aid
- LRIP provides funding assistance to local agencies – counties, cities, towns, and tribes – for constructing or reconstructing local roads
  - Trunk Highway Corridor Account
  - Routes of Regional Significance Account
  - Rural Road Safety Account
- Projects are selected through a competitive solicitation process
- LRIP Advisory Committee provides recommendations as to which projects will be funded

## Local Bridge Replacement Program



- 15,732 bridge structures on the local system
- 735 of these structures are eligible for replacement based on condition ratings
- The LBRP provides local agencies transportation funding for the reconstruction, rehabilitation and/or removal of bridges or structures on their local road system.
- Master Bridge Priority List: a compilation of all eligible local bridge projects identified by local bridge owners as priority for replacement or rehabilitation

## Program Needs



Counties are grateful for the investment in these programs in the 2023 capital investment package, but significant needs still exist:

- Local bridges: Over the next five years, local agencies have identified 948 priority bridge replacement projects, requesting \$282 million in state bridge funds, with approximately \$740 million in total construction costs
- Local roads: During the 2023 LRIP competitive solicitation process, MnDOT State Aid received 378 applications requesting a total of \$417 million in LRIP funding for the \$103 million available.

#### 2025 Bill Introductions



- **SF1535** (Hawj) LGRWRP funding: \$15 million GO bonds, \$11.5 million GF cash, \$9.5 million annual base budget funding to BWSR
- **SF1281** (Kreun) LGRWRP funding: \$15 million GO bonds, \$11.5 million GF cash, \$15 million in FY27 base budget funding to BWSR
- SF1170 (Kreun) \$15 million in GO bonds for LGRWRP
- **SF289** (Abeler) \$250 million GO bonds for LRIP, \$150 million GO bonds for LBRP
- **SF2185** (Johnson Stewart) \$250 million GO bonds for LRIP, \$150 million GO bonds for LBRP
