



S.F. No. 1729 – Modifications to the sale of cannabinoids derived from hemp

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S.F. 1729 amends provisions regarding the sale of cannabinoids derived from hemp.

Section 1 allows products containing nonintoxicating cannabinoids to be sold for human or animal consumption only if it is intended for application externally to a part of the body of a human or animal. It may not be manufactured, marketed, distributed, or intended to be consumed through injection or application to nonintact skin or a mucous membrane, except for products applied sublingually.

Section 2 requires lower-potency hemp edible manufacturers to comply with state and local building, fire, and zoning codes, requirements, and regulations.

Lower-potency hemp edible manufacturers must ensure that licensed premises are maintained in a clean and sanitary condition and are free from infestation by insects, rodents, or other pests.

Section 3 strikes language that allows certain information to be provided through the use of a scannable barcode.

Section 4 states that hemp-derived topical products must not be manufactured, marketed, distributed, or intended to be consumed through injection or application to nonintact skin or a mucous membrane, except for products applied sublingually.
