The Property

Located at 340 Cedar Street in downtown Saint Paul, the site has ample room to achieve project goals. The former Saint Paul Athletic Club is a 13-story structure designed in 1915 by one of the architects behind New York's Grand Central Station. Located next to Saint Paul's Central Station light rail stop, the edifice is the former home to Lifetime Fitness, Hotel 340, and the College of St. Scholastica. The building features a commercial kitchen, office and meeting space, 56 sleeping rooms, a full gym, and a swimming pool.
