On behalf of the Greater St. Cloud Development Corporation (GSDC), I write to express our strong support for SF761, the Minnesota Energy Alley bill. As a private, regional economic development organization dedicated to advancing business investment, job creation, and innovation in Central Minnesota, we recognize the essential role this initiative plays in shaping our state's clean energy and economic future.
