Created by the Minnesota Legislature in 1903, it is one of the oldest state government arts agencies in the country.

## **KEY DUTIES**


- Provide financial support for artistic activities throughout the state
- Serve as fiscal agent for a statewide network of regional arts councils
- Provide advice to other state departments relating to the arts: Capital Art Exhibit Advisory Committee, Capital Area Architectural and Planning Board, State Designer Selection Board, Governor's Residence Council
- Manage the Minnesota Percent for Art in Public Places program, through a delegation from the Minnesota Department of Administration




Revenue and Expenditures

# **Application Process**

- Announce deadlines in January <a href="https://www.arts.state.mn.us/calendar/">https://www.arts.state.mn.us/calendar/</a>
- Post application materials at least eight weeks before application deadlines
- Webinars grant opportunities for individuals and organizations
- Online information sessions live and recorded
- In person grants workshops and events
- One-on-one applicant support



# **Application review and grants management**

- Staff reviews for eligibility and completeness
- Financial review (\*)
- Advisor panels review and prescore
- Administrative / artistic visits (\*)
- Advisor panels review applications in public meetings
- Advisor panels assign final scores
- Allocate funding based on ranked scores
- Board review and approval
- Monitoring / financial reconciliation (\*)
- Final reports

#### (\*) Grants > \$50,000





# Regional Arts Council System

Created in 1977. Councils receive state funds for local or regional arts development.



- 501(c)(3) nonprofit organizations
- Local boards, local decision-making
- Needs assessments
- Biennial plans
- Programs and services tailored to the region
- Plans are reviewed in open, public meetings
- Reports and financial reconciliation



# By The Numbers


In the 2022-2023 biennium, the Arts Board and regional arts councils together...
