(b) A member appointed under paragraph (a) may not be a registered lobbyist.
(c) The appointing authorities must make the appointments by July 1, 2025.
Subd. 3. Duties. The task force must:
(1) gather and review data on the impact of foraging on species resilience, ecosystem
health, and other aspects of Minnesota's diverse biomes;
(2) review existing regulations governing foraging activities on state lands;
(3) develop recommendations for science-based, data-driven foraging guidelines for
