The preservation of Manoomin/Psíŋ is urgent in order to maintain the health of freshwater habitats. This plant species serves as a vital component of Minnesota's ecosystems and a critical resource that sustains the natural environment. Without immediate action to protect it, we risk irreparable damage to the delicate balance of natural resources. As legislators, your support is crucial for safeguarding Manoomin/Psíŋ for future generations. We view the rights of Manoomin/Psíŋ is critical to protecting and preserving this sacred plant for future generations.

Minnesota's wild rice is under threat from a proposed nickel mine As the demand for minerals for the renewable energy transition rises, it is increasingly important to recognize the significant environmental and social risks associated with metals mining including habitat destruction, soil erosion, and acid mine drainage, a process that can require water treatment in perpetuity.
