This initiative presents a meaningful opportunity to ensure sustainable, equitable access to Minnesota's diverse natural resources, guided by robust scientific data and sensitivity to cultural and traditional practices. Most of all, we are excited that this would ensure a transparent process to determining access to state lands for foraging activities.
