

1.1 Senator moves to amend the delete-everything amendment (SCS3045A-1)
1.2 to S.F. No. 3045 as follows:

1.3 Page 42, after line 2, insert:

1.4 "Sec. 37. Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 349A.06, subdivision 4, is amended to read:

1.5 Subd. 4. **Criminal history.** (a) Upon the director's request, an applicant for a lottery
1.6 retailer contract must submit a completed criminal history records check consent form, a
1.7 full set of classifiable fingerprints, and required fees to the director or the Bureau of Criminal
1.8 Apprehension. Upon receipt of this information, the director must submit the completed
1.9 criminal history records check consent form, full set of classifiable fingerprints, and required
1.10 fees to the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension.

1.11 (b) After receiving this information, the bureau must conduct a Minnesota criminal
1.12 history records check of the individual. The bureau is authorized to exchange the fingerprints
1.13 with the Federal Bureau of Investigation to obtain the applicant's national criminal history
1.14 record information. The bureau shall return the results of the Minnesota and national criminal
1.15 history records checks to the director to determine the individual's compliance with the
1.16 requirements of subdivision 2.

1.17 (c) The director shall request a Minnesota and national criminal history check for any
1.18 sole proprietor or responsible lottery official who applies to be a lottery retailer who (1) has
1.19 not undergone a check under this section within the past seven years or (2) has had any
1.20 lapse in its contracts to sell lottery tickets.

1.21 (d) The director may request the director of alcohol and gambling enforcement to
1.22 investigate all applicants for lottery retailer contracts to determine their compliance with
1.23 the requirements of subdivision 2. The director may issue a temporary contract, valid for
1.24 not more than 90 days, to an applicant pending the completion of the investigation or a final
1.25 determination of qualifications under this section. The director has access to all criminal
1.26 history data compiled by the director of alcohol and gambling enforcement and the Bureau
1.27 of Criminal Apprehension on (1) any person holding or applying for a retailer contract, (2)
1.28 any person holding a lottery vendor contract or who has submitted a bid on such a contract,
1.29 and (3) any person applying for employment with the lottery."
