1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. TRAFFIC CALMING INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS
1.6	PROGRAM.
1.7	(a) \$10,000,000 in fiscal year 2026 and \$10,000,000 in fiscal year 2027 are appropriated
1.8	from the general fund to the commissioner of transportation for grants to cities of the first
1.9	class for traffic calming infrastructure improvements. The commissioner must distribute
1.10	the grant aid as follows:
1.11	(1) 50 percent of the funds proportionally based on each city's share of population,
1.12	according to the last federal decennial census, compared to the total population of all cities
1.13	of the first class; and
1.14	(2) 50 percent of the funds proportionally based on each city's share of money needs,
1.15	as determined under Minnesota Statutes, section 162.13, subdivision 2, compared to the
