

## S.F. No. 2136 – Department of Transportation Policy Omnibus

S.F. 2136 makes a variety of policy and technical changes to transportation-related policy.

**Sections 1 and 2** modify statutorily designated routes on the trunk highway system.

**Section 3** amends the definition of an intersection to remove an obsolete provision related to the crossing of certain roadways over a divided highway.

**Section 4** updates what a steady yellow light indicates to a driver to include a reference to a flashing yellow light.

**Section 5** clarifies accident reporting requirements of a peace officer to mandate a report to the commissioner of public safety whenever an accident results in a bodily injury.

**Sections 6 to 9** establish and permits an individual to use electronic attestation methods for certain aircraft registration requirements.

**Section 10** makes a technical change to the definition of an unmanned aerial system.
