

Senator Dibble from the Committee on Transportation, to which was referred

S.F. No. 2161: A bill for an act relating to transportation; modifying requirements of photographs on drivers' licenses and identification cards for certain individuals with medical devices; amending Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 171.071, subdivision 2.

Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

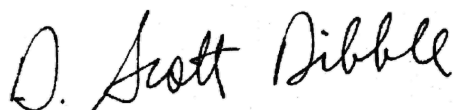
"Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 171.071, subdivision 2, is amended to read:

Subd. 2. **Certain head wear permitted.** If an accident involving a head injury, serious illness, or treatment of the illness has resulted in hair loss or the need to maintain continuous coverage of the head or scalp by an applicant for a driver's license or identification card, the commissioner ~~shall~~ must permit the applicant to wear a hat or similar head wear or a medically required covering in the photograph or electronically produced image and must not require the removal of the medically required covering for the photograph or electronically produced image. The hat, medically required covering, or head wear must be of an appropriate size and type to allow identification of the holder of the license or card and must not obscure the holder's face."

Amend the title as follows:

Page 1, line 3, delete "medical devices" and insert "a medical covering"

And when so amended the bill do pass. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.
