Re: Concerns regarding SF 1144 and HF 1011

Dear Senator Maye Quade and Representative Bierman,

Thank you for the opportunity to review SF 1144/HF 1011, which seeks to expand the scope of practice for optometrists in the state. I understand that conversations have occurred between the stakeholders and changes have been made to the version from last year, and so I appreciate the opportunity to provide the following comments to underscore that Mayo Clinic continues to have concerns with the proposal.

Mayo Clinic is the world's oldest integrated medical practice with a mission to inspire hope and promote healing and wellness through practice, research and education. Mayo traditionally does not take positions on scope of practice issues except in the rarest of circumstances when there are concerns that such changes could impact patient care, outcomes and safety. The proposal under consideration meets this threshold in our review, and the risks to patient health exceed the potential benefits of this expanded role, especially as it relates to the expanded surgical and prescribing authorities. As noted, similar legislation has been introduced in the past, but the safety concerns remain in this latest iteration. Mayo Clinic is aligned with the Minnesota Academy of Ophthalmology (MAO) in opposing the legislation.

Thank you, again, for the opportunity to share these concerns, and I would be happy to discuss further if so desired.
