Re: Support for SF 1691 – Appropriation for African American-Focused Homeplace

I am writing to express my strong support for SF 1691, which allocates \$1,000,000 for a grant to the Birth Justice Collaborative. This funding will be instrumental in strengthening and implementing the African American-focused Homeplace model in Hennepin County, a vital initiative aimed at improving maternal and child health outcomes.

As a Public Health Nurse Practitioner and former Maternal & Child Home visiting Nurse, I have seen first hand the systemic barriers to accessing quality maternal care that African American mothers and families face. Barriers lead to significant disparities in health outcomes. Myself and many scholars in my field believe that investing in culturally centered healing and support during pregnancy and the postpartum period is the most beneficial way forward to ensuring that more families receive the assistance they require.

The Homeplace model delivers essential care and plays a crucial role in addressing racial disparities in maternal and infant health. This model is specifically designed to offer critical care for expecting mothers and support the entire family system throughout the pregnancy experience. It includes programs that engage partners, grandparents, and other family members, ensuring that everyone receives the education, emotional support, and resources necessary for a healthy pregnancy and birth. Supporting the entire family system is essential, as a collaborative approach it strengthens family bonds and creates a nurturing environment for both mother and child.

This investment has the potential to create meaningful, lasting change by enhancing access to culturally competent care, fostering better health outcomes, and establishing a precedent for similar programs statewide. I strongly urge you to support SF 1691 and advocate for its passage to ensure that African American families in Hennepin County receive the care and support they deserve.
