## **Glossary of Terms**

AFR (Assigned Family Responsibility): The amount of a family's contribution to a student's cost of attendance under Minnesota law, calculated by weighting the federally-determined student aid index value ASR (Assigned Student Responsibility): The amount of a student's contribution to their cost of attendance under Minnesota law

COA (Cost of Attendance): A living and miscellaneous expense allowance established in Minnesota law plus a tuition and fees allowance up to the maximum established in Minnesota law

FPG (Federal Poverty Guidelines): Federal thresholds that indicate the minimum amount of annual income an individual or family needs to meet basic needs, such as housing, utilities, clothing, food, and transportation

SAI (Student Aid Index): A federal formula-based index number ranging from -1,500 to 999,999 that helps postsecondary institutions determine how much financial support a student may need

Unrationed state grant awards = Cost of attendance - assigned student responsibility - assigned family responsibility - federal Pell Grant award
