


Housing Cost Burdened in Olmsted County

Vulnerable Populations in Olmsted County









What Housing Can Do

When a family is housed in an appropriate sized space and spending less than 30% of their household income on housing, the impact is significant.

Family impacts

- Safe, sanitary, stable housing
- Increased spending on food, health care, education
- Able to build savings
- Improved mental health
- Improved performance at school and work

- Provides stable workforce
- Increased discretionary spending; improved economy
- Improved productivity at work; decreased absenteeism
- Reduced public health costs
- Reduced human services costs
- Reduced justice system costs
