Senator moves to amend S.F. No. 2383 as follows:

Page 1, after line 3, insert:

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"Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2024, section 256.9752, subdivision 2, is amended to read:

Subd. 2. **Authority.** The Minnesota Board on Aging shall allocate to area agencies on aging the state and federal funds which are received for the senior nutrition programs of congregate dining and home-delivered meals in a manner consistent with federal requirements. Each area agency on aging may use up to five percent of its allocation from state funds under this section for administration and oversight.

Sec. 2. [256.9757] SENIOR SUPPORTIVE SERVICES PROGRAM.

Subdivision 1. **Program goals.** It is a goal of all area agencies on aging to provide, within the limits of available funds, operational funding to providers of supportive services.

Supportive services are provided to individuals in an individual's residence and in the community to promote, maintain, maximize, or restore the individual's level of independence, while minimizing the effects of disability or illness.

- Subd. 2. Authority. (a) The Minnesota Board on Aging shall allocate to area agencies on aging through its intrastate funding formula the state funds that are received under this section for the senior supportive services program. Each area agency on aging may use up to five percent of its allocation under this section for administration and oversight.
- (b) Each area agency on aging must award its available allocation to local providers of supportive services through a competitive process. Each area agency on aging must award at least 50 percent of the available allocation to providers of assisted transportation services.

 The area agency on aging must award the remaining balance of its allocation for homemaker services and chore services.
- Subd. 3. Senior supportive services. Funds allocated under this section for senior supportive services must be used for administration and oversight and to provide the supportive services of homemaker, chore, and assisted transportation as defined by the board.
- Subd. 4. Report. By January 15, 2027, and every other January 15 thereafter, the

 Minnesota Board on Aging shall submit a progress report about the senior supportive services

 program to the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with

 jurisdiction over human services. The progress report must include metrics of the use of the

 grant program.
