1.4 "Sec. 2. Laws 2024, chapter 127, article 49, section 9, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

1.5 Subdivision 1. **Establishment; purpose.** The Mentally Ill and Dangerous Civil
1.6 Commitment Reform Task Force is established to:

1.7 (1) evaluate current statutes related to mentally ill and dangerous civil commitments
1.8 and;

1.9 (2) evaluate current statutes related to the process by which a former patient may seek
1.10 an order to expunge or vacate a prior commitment order; and

1.11 (3) develop recommendations to optimize the use of state-operated mental health
1.12 resources and increase equitable access and outcomes for patients.

1.13 Sec. 3. Laws 2024, chapter 127, article 49, section 9, is amended by adding a subdivision
1.14 to read:

1.15 Subd. 7a. **Duties; expungements and vacatur.** The task force must:

1.16 (1) analyze current trends in civil commitments, expungements, and vacatur, including
1.17 but not limited to the frequency of expungements and vacatur in Minnesota as compared
1.18 to other jurisdictions;

1.19 (2) review national practices and criteria for expunging and vacating civil commitment
1.20 orders;

1.21 (3) develop recommended statutory changes necessary to provide clear direction to
1.22 former patients who are seeking to file a motion to expunge or vacate a civil commitment;

1.23 (4) develop recommended statutory changes necessary to provide clear direction, criteria
1.24 to apply, and evidentiary standards to the courts when considering a motion from a former
1.25 patient to expunge or vacate a civil commitment; and

1.26 (5) develop recommended statutory changes to provide clear direction to former patients
1.27 and the courts to address situations in which an individual is civilly committed and is later
1.28 determined to not have an organic disorder of the brain or a substantial psychiatric disorder
1.29 of thought, mood, perception, orientation, or memory.

2.2 Subd. 8. **Report required.** (a) By August 1, 2025, the task force shall submit to the
2.3 chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over
2.4 mentally ill and dangerous civil commitments a written report that includes the outcome of
2.5 the duties in subdivision 7, including but not limited to recommended statutory changes.

2.6 (b) By August 1, 2026, the task force shall submit to the chairs and ranking minority
2.7 members of the legislative committees with jurisdiction over civil commitments a written
2.8 report that includes the outcome of the duties in subdivision 7a, including but not limited
2.9 to recommended statutory changes.

2.11 Subd. 9. **Expiration.** The task force expires January 1, ~~2026~~ 2027."
