1.5	Section 1. [268.1821] FRAUD REPORTING PORTAL.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Creation of fraud reporting portal. The commissioner shall provide a
1.7	portal for employers to report information regarding potential applicant fraud. The
1.8	commissioner may add the reporting elements listed in subdivision 2 to an existing online
1.9	fraud reporting system accessible by employers.
1.10	Subd. 2. Reporting elements. At a minimum, the following elements must be included
1.11	as part of the fraud reporting portal:
1.12	(1) that an applicant was a no-show for a scheduled interview;
