In 2024, African Economic Development Solutions (AEDS) achieved remarkable milestones, transforming lives and dreams across Minnesota's African immigrant community and beyond. With \$2.07 million deployed in loans to small businesses—65% of which were women-owned—AEDS provided more than funding. It ignited hope, resilience, and the promise of a brighter future.

AEDS also served 1,052 clients, empowering individuals through a range of services tailored to the unique needs of the community. Of these, 124 graduated from AEDS's culturally intelligent business development training program, and 152 individuals participated in AEDS's Homeownership Workshop, gaining valuable insights and resources to achieve their homeownership goals. These graduates represent dreams realized and potential unlocked. Armed with knowledge, tools, and confidence, they will be shaping their futures and making meaningful contributions to their communities through innovative business ventures.



The businesses supported by AEDS in 2024 are cultural hubs, safe spaces, and engines of opportunity. They enable families to gain stability, inspire others to pursue their aspirations, and contribute to Minnesota's diverse and vibrant economy.

10TH ANNUAL LITTLE AFRICA FESTIVAL & PARADE



The 10th annual Little Africa Festival, held on August 4th, 2024, celebrated African culture and the transformative power of creative placemaking—a concept central to the festival's evolution over the past decade. What began as a platform to showcase African heritage through art and culture has grown into a signature event that bolsters community pride and drives economic development.

This year, approximately 10,000 attendees gathered at Hamline Park to enjoy food, art, and music. The festival featured 80 individual performing artists who brought vibrant energy to the stage, while the colorful parade symbolized unity and cultural celebration. Beyond entertainment, the festival provided critical economic opportunities by highlighting the creativity, talents, and businesses of African immigrants, offering a platform for growth and connection with broader audiences. With the support of 25 volunteers, the event demonstrated the ability of creative placemaking to create spaces where culture, commerce, and community flourish. The Little Africa Festival remains a shining example of how cultural expression can fuel economic opportunities and foster sustainable growth for African immigrant communities in Minnesota.

5TH NATIONAL AFRICAN LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE & QUARTERLY FORUMS
