SF2301 – Comunidades Latinas Unidas En Servicio (CLUES) Introduced by Senator Hawj

CLUES requests \$4M for the biennium (\$2M per year) from the Workforce Development Fund to expand skills-building, workforce training, and customized employment coaching for individuals to access better paying jobs and potentially transition to new careers. CLUES promotes socio-economic mobility by connecting low-income individuals to employers and new job skills training that provide higher wages and certifications in highdemand industries, thus generating sustainable and livable wages. Legislative support helps students access trainings and tailored skills building and employment coaching, including on-line and in-person trainings during evenings and weekend schedules.

CLUES aims to build economic mobility through skill development and personalized employment support, ensuring more individuals can thrive in today's workforce. Through short-term training and certification programs, career navigation, job placement assistance, and small business support, we equip participants with the skills necessary to secure well-paying, sustainable careers. Our high-demand programs, including Commercial Drivers' License (CDL) and phlebotomy training, consistently maintain waitlists, highlighting a growing need for our programs.

CLUES Youth Workforce Programming

Each year an average of 350 youth participate in our programming, engaging in a structured pathway that combines hands-on tech experiences with professional development and leadership opportunities.

Our Youth Workforce Programs empower young people ages 14 to 24 by connecting them with critical resources, skills training, and career exploration opportunities. Through our Best Buy Teen Tech Center (BBTTC@CLUES), we engage hundreds of young people annually in immersive learning experiences that foster both hard and soft skills essential for success in today's workforce.
