1.5	Section 1. APPROPRIATION; ASSISTANCE TO MINNESOTA SMALL
1.6	BUSINESSES TO SECURE FEDERAL RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT
1.7	FUNDING.
1.8	(a) \$5,000,000 in fiscal year 2026 is appropriated from the general fund to the
1.9	commissioner of employment and economic development for a grant to MNSBIR, Inc., for
1.10	support of the small business research and development goals provided in Minnesota Statutes,
1.11	section 3.222. This appropriation is onetime and is available until June 30, 2027.
1.12	(b) The purpose of the grant is to support moving scientific excellence and technological
1.13	innovation from the lab to the market for startups and small businesses by:
1.14	(1) securing federal research and development funding to build a strong innovation
1.15	economy and stimulate the creation of novel products, services, and solutions;
1.16	(2) strengthening the role of startups and small businesses in meeting federal research
1.17	and development needs;
1.18	(3) increasing the commercial application of federally supported research results; and
1.19	(4) developing and increasing the Minnesota workforce, especially by fostering and
1.20	encouraging participation by small businesses owned by people who are Black, Indigenous,
1.21	People of Color, and women.

2.1	(c) MNSBIR, Inc. shall use grant money to become the federal research and development
2.2	dedicated resource for Minnesota small businesses to support research and commercialization
2.3	of novel ideas, concepts, and projects to develop cutting-edge products and services for

2.5	(1) assist startups and small businesses in securing federal research and development
2.6	funding including the small business innovation research and small business technology
