RIGOROUS LSAT PREPARATION

LSAT examination is completed to be accepted into law school. Four participants completed the intensive LSAT prep course and scored as high as 165 on the LSAT exam. A high score provides participants access to receive potential full-ride scholarship to some MN law schools.
