In addition, we are excited about the opportunity to grow our meat-cutting program in partnership with Ridgewater Community College, as well as our transportation and driving program that will allow warehouse workers in the industry to advance their career by training to become an in-demand transportation professional.

With continued funding, we are also planning on expanding Carts to Careers to support the recruitment and training of two essential worker groups: individuals with disabilities and those reentering the workforce after incarceration. Grocery stores offer flexible hours and a variety of tasks, making them an ideal environment for individuals with disabilities, fostering a positive, inclusive workplace culture. Additionally, food producers have found success in hiring formerly incarcerated workers, addressing workforce shortages while providing returning individuals with stability and purpose as they reintegrate into society.

A strong workforce is crucial to maintaining viable grocery stores and a robust supply chain, and we are proud to offer rewarding career paths across our industry, from farm to fork. Thank you again for your support of the Carts to Careers program
