



S.F. No. 191 – Fleeing a Peace Officer

S.F. No. 191 establishes two new felony offenses for fleeing a peace officer in a motor vehicle. The first applies if the offender operates the vehicle in a culpably negligent manner and carries a statutory maximum sentence of four years/\$8k fine (**section 2**) and a driver's license revocation of not less than four years (**section 1**). The second applies if, during the course of the fleeing, the offender fails to obey certain road signs, signals, or markings, or fails to keep on the proper side of the road (**section 3**). This offense carries a statutory maximum sentence of five years/\$10k fine and a driver's license revocation (**section 1**) of an unspecified period. In addition, the bill provides an exception to the general prohibition on the use of mobile tracking devices without a court order when used on a fleeing motor vehicle (**section 5**).
