

S.F. No. 1813 – Brady-Giglio Lists, Prosecutor Responsibilities

S.F No. 1813 requires prosecutors who maintain a Brady-Giglio list to provide a process for peace officers who are placed on or are about to be placed on the list to challenge the placement. Requires prosecutors to adopt a policy addressing the criteria used to place officers on the list and grants officers certain rights relating to the process. Defines key terms used in the bill including "Brady-Giglio List" and Brady-Giglio Material." Prohibits prosecutors from releasing to the public a peace officer's personnel file and related materials unless otherwise provided by law. Requires prosecutors to meet annually with local chief law enforcement officers to review the prosecutor's Brady-Giglio policy and evaluate the prosecutor's disclosure process. States that nothing in the bill modifies the independent duty of the prosecutor to disclose Brady-Giglio material as required by caselaw.
