

S.F. No. 662 – Cause of action; nonconsensual removal of a condom

S.F. 662 permits a civil cause of action against a person who removes a condom and causes contact between the sexual organ from which the condom is removed and the intimate part of another person who did not consent to the removal of the condom. The bill defines “condom” and “intimate part.”

The person alleged to have removed a condom in violation of this section is liable to the injured party for: general damages, special damages, and punitive damages. The court may award to a prevailing plaintiff a civil penalty up to the amount of \$10,000, equitable relief, and reasonable attorney fees.

The court must allow plaintiffs to make confidential filings.

Effective date. This section is effective August 1, 2025, and applies to causes of action accruing on or after that date.
