## **OUR MISSION:**

To increase the self-sufficiency of participants and their families.

#### **OUR PARTICIPANTS:**

Participants are people who have been at home caring for family while dependent on someone else's income. They have lost that source of income through a personal loss-death, disability, divorce, abandonment, or loss of public assistance. Amid this transitional crisis they face a radical life and occupational reorientation.

#### **OUR PROGRAM:**

The Minnesota Family Resiliency Partnership is a pre-employment and family stabilization program. It is the ONLY program in the state designed to help this unemployed or underemployed population to address their unique barriers to self-sufficiency.

The program addresses work readiness by teaching participants:

- essential life-skills needed to stabilize their family situation.
- necessary job-related skills needed to conduct a successful job search.
- intensive individualized support.
- homelessness intervention and prevention.
- training and college academic advising for career development.
- assistance with gaining employment.

## **DEMOGRAPHICS:**

Participants in the MN Family Resiliency Partnership are:

- Female 96%
- Brown, black, and indigenous 36%
- Victims of domestic violence 73%
- Not receiving court ordered child support-75%
- Homeless 28%

# **OUR OUTCOMES:**

- 97% successfully completed their program. Meaning they are employed, continuing their education or achieved the goals they set at in-take.
- Became employed with an average hourly wage in 2024 of \$20.38

- It is an Adult Career Pathways program administered by the Minnesota Department of Employment and Economic Development (DEED).
- All participants enrolled in the Minnesota Family Resiliency
  Partnership live at 200% of the federal poverty guidelines or even less.

## **FINANCIAL OUTCOMES:**

 The regional MN Family Resiliency Partnership is funded primarily by fees.
The cost per participant for 12 plus months of service is \$2,930.00.
