



S.F. No. 1836 – Issuance of citations to pedestrians limitation

S.F. 1836 limits the authority to issue a citation to a pedestrian crossing the roadway in a variety of circumstances.

Section 1 limits the circumstances by which a pedestrian may be issued a citation for entering a roadway to cross after the display of a steady yellow signal or a steady red signal. A pedestrian may only be issued a citation if they are stopped for an unrelated violation and at the time of violation, the vehicle approaches in a manner that constitutes a hazard of collision between the vehicle and pedestrian. Makes technical changes by striking shall and inserting “must.” Effective August 1, 2025.

Section 2 limits the circumstances by which a pedestrian may be issued a citation for entering a cross walk during a flashing or steady display of a “Don’t Walk” pedestrian signal. A pedestrian may only be issued a citation if they are stopped for an unrelated violation and at the time of violation, the vehicle approaches in a manner that constitutes a hazard of collision between the vehicle and pedestrian. Makes technical changes by striking shall and inserting “must.” Effective August 1, 2025.

Section 3 limits the circumstances by which a pedestrian may be issued a citation for not using a crosswalk when crossing a roadway between adjacent intersections with operational traffic signals. A pedestrian may only be issued a citation if they are stopped for an unrelated violation and at the time of violation, the vehicle approaches in a manner that constitutes a hazard of collision between the vehicle and pedestrian. Makes technical changes by striking shall and inserting “must.” Effective August 1, 2025.
