

S.F. No. 1484 – DWI license plate impoundment law modifications

Section 1 makes it a misdemeanor to intentionally remove or damage a permanent sticker affixed to and invalidating a registration plate under the DWI license plate impoundment law (see **section 2**).

Section 2 amends the DWI license plate impoundment law to permit a peace officer, as an alternative to seizing and destroying the plates at the time of the violation, to invalidate the plates by affixing a permanent sticker on them.

Section 3 amends the DWI license plate impoundment law to provide that when a plate impoundment violation is predicated on the results of a chemical test of the person's breath, or on a test refusal, the person must be issued a temporary vehicle permit valid for 14 days rather than seven days. Requires a temporary permit valid for 45 days if the person submits to a chemical test of the person's blood or urine.
