

S.F. No. 2457 – Data Calls and the Limited Long-Term Care Insurance Act (1st Engrossment)

Section 1 (amends section 45.027, subdivision 1) allows the commissioner of commerce to issue data calls.

Section 2 (amends section 45.027) provides that information provided in response to data calls be treated as nonpublic data and is not subject to subpoena.

Section 3 (amends section 45.027, subdivision 2) allows the commissioner to issue data calls for the purpose of an investigation.

Section 4 [62A.481; Limited Long-Term Care Insurance] establishes the Limited Long-Term Care Insurance Act.

This section defines several terms including "limited long-term care insurance" which means an insurance policy offered for less than 12 months for one or more necessary or medically necessary diagnostic, preventive, therapeutic, or personal care service in a setting other than a hospital's acute care unit.

This section applies to policies issued or delivered in Minnesota on or after January 1, 2026.

This section provides for the terms and conditions of limited long-term care insurance.
