Chair McEwen and Senate Labor Committee Members -

The National Federation of Independent Business (NFIB) represents over 10,000 small and independently owned businesses across Minnesota. Our mission is to promote and protect the rights of our members to own, operate, and grow their businesses. Thank you for the opportunity to provide comments on Senate File 2373, specifically the expansion of Minnesota's mandatory break laws and provision of penalties for noncompliance.

NFIB opposes the penalties outlined in Article 3 of the DE amendment to SF 2373. We are concerned that the proposed fines, including liquidated damages and penalties of up to \$1,000 per day per employee, are excessive and fail to consider simple misunderstandings or situations where an employee may fail to take a break without knowledge of the employer. A small oversight or scheduling issue could result in financial devastation, especially for small businesses or organizations with rotating staff and part-time workers. Small employers will feel the need to closely monitor their employees to ensure that breaks are taken at the correct time and for the proper duration, out of fear that they will incur severe penalties.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide comments. We strongly urge the committee to consider our concerns.
