In anticipation of possible disruptions, six programs with November 1 and December 1 federal grant deadlines (listed below) have been advised by DCYF they may use their approved state Head Start allocations as an interim measure to maintain operations and service continuity during the temporary federal funding disruption. Using these funds to sustain operations during a federal funding disruption aligns with the intent of the state allocation and supports continuity of care for children and families. Based on DCYF's assessment, the 27 Head Start grantees in Minnesota have federal awards that are not immediately impacted by the federal shutdown.
