My life felt like it was falling apart. I ended up moving back with my parents, starting over, and exploring other opportunities to bring my joy back.

For a long time, I worked random jobs to build up my resume, secretly hoping to discover other opportunities to bring my joy back. I couldn't find joy. Then Metro Deaf School opened a door: an opportunity for me to work as a paraprofessional. I was able to bring my joy back.

I want to return to school as a teacher again to chase my dreams. This bill will help me with my student loans to become a successful teacher one day. It will help others chase their dreams to become teachers for our children, who are the future of this nation. Thank you to Senator Johnson Stewart for carrying this bill. I also thank this committee for your time and ask that you support SF0249 to open the door for more aspiring Deaf Education teachers like me.
