
A Proclamation of United Nations Week

The United Nations today offers the best hope of the peoples of the world for making secure the principle of justice for all nations and the high objective of a world at peace, for which our country, together with other democratic nations, made such great and costly sacrifices.


The United Nations organization will succeed only if the desire of all peoples for peace is strong enough and well informed enough to enable the representatives of the civilized nations of the world to find a common ground of understanding and to improve and strengthen the promising new charter upon which the united program of international co-operation and understanding is to be based.

Therefore, in proclaiming the week of September 22 to 28, 1946, as United Nations Week, I urge the people of Minnesota to become better informed about the work of the United Nations organization, to give it the spirited support that it must have to succeed, and to help make its purposes and deliberations such as to provide a truly solid and effective foundation for world peace.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of the State of Minnesota to be affixed at the State Capitol in St. Paul this 18th day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred forty-six and of the State, the eighty-ninth.
