A PROCLAMATION BY THE GOVERNOR

Recognizing the glorious chapters in American history written by the men and
women of the United States Navy, a day has recently been set aside when all Americans
could celebrate their service. Sunday, October 27, 1946 has been established for
the observance throughout the land.

Observance of this day is especially significant this year, not only because
the American people are especially aware of the large and vital part the Navy played
in achieving the victory of our armed forces in World War II, but because they look
forward to the continued dedication and importance of a strong Naval Service as an
essential ingredient of our national security. See the slogan for Navy Day this
year so concisely stated: "Your Navy - Victor in War, Guardian in Peace."

Therefore, in proclaiming Sunday, October 27, 1946 as Navy Day in Minnesota,
in conformity with the national observance, I invite our citizens generally to join
in public expression of appreciation and recognition of the men and ships of the United
States Navy.

Observed Navy Day Sunday, to be fitting and appropriate naval parades
and other activities be conducted on that day, including naval flavor parades in honor
of those who have given all we can in defense of their country, and the other em-
inent features of the day to include the preceding Sunday as the following Friday.

of the State of Minnesota to be affixed
at the City of St. Paul in the Year of
our Lord one thousand nine
hundred forty-six and of the State,
one hundred thirty-first.
