

RESOLUTION.

Whereas, At the annual village election held in this village on the 12th day of March, 1912, the proposition of re-incorporating the general law, viz: Chap. 146, Laws of 1891, under which this village was organized, and of being thenceforth governed by the provisions of Chap. 9, R.S. 1905, was duly and regularly submitted to the legal voters of this village;

And, Whereas, It appears by the returns of said election that 117 votes were cast at said election, that there were 68 votes in favor of re-incorporation, and that there were 21 votes against re-incorporation;

Now, Therefore, It is hereby Resolved by the village council of the village of Arlington, Shelby County, Illinois, That a majority of the votes cast at said election were in the affirmative on, and in favor of, the proposition that this village be governed by the provisions of Chap. 9, R.S. 1905;

And, It is further Resolved, That certified copies of this resolution be by the village recorder forthwith transmitted to and filed with the County Auditor of said County and the Secretary of said State of Illinois in the manner provided by law.
