KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and particularly by authority of Section 114, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, and the written request of the Commissioner of Taxation, do hereby constitute and appoint Charles P. Stone of Minneapolis, Minnesota, as Special Assistant Attorney General for the Department of Taxation, for the period commencing January 6, 1947, and to serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General, or until this commission shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with law; and on the recommendation of said department, I hereby fix the compensation of said Charles P. Stone as such Special Assistant Attorney General for the Department of Taxation at the sum of Four Thousand Six Hundred Twenty Dollars (\$4,620) per year, to be paid from the appropriations made for the Department of Taxation.
