KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, That I, J. A. A. Burnquist, Attorney General of the State of Minnesota, by virtue of the authority vested in me by statute, and particularly by authority of Section 114, Mason's Minnesota Statutes of 1927, do hereby constitute and appoint John H. Burwell, of Minneapolis, Minnesota, as Special Attorney for the Department of Conservation, with the title of Special Assistant Attorney General, and I hereby fix his compensation in the sum of Five Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$5,000) per year, said sum to be paid by the Department of Conservation. Said appointment to commence on January 6, 1947, and said appointee to serve at the pleasure of the Attorney General or until this commission shall be revoked or otherwise terminated in accordance with law.
